Dear Friends,

One Mandarin Chinese character used for identifying children living with autism is the same as a character used to describe the stars in the sky. The character, literally translated, means "Extremely bright and impossible to reach." What a brilliant and dichotomous definition this is of one of the worlds' largest and most inexplicable challenges. I like challenges. You, as participants and contributors to SEAPC must like challenges too! Through the years, we have faced seemingly impossible circumstances with confidence and boldness, not in our own capabilities or resources, but that through the power of prayer, God would provide us with the answers we need. Together, we have witnessed the most impossible challenges become unthinkable opportunities and ultimately incomprehensible success stories of lives that have been changed.

As we have prayed, changes surely have come to the nations! We witnessed one such example in 2014 as Prime Minister Hun Sen of Cambodia gave SEAPC a "Nation Changer" award; congratulating the SEAPC Cambodia Christian School Network the educational accomplishments of its 178 teachers and 4,000 students. It was the Deputy Prime Minister, General Ke Kim Yan, who acknowledged that we are a Christian Prayer organization, rather than just a secular educational institution, and that through prayer we have found success. This seemed impossible just 8 years ago, when my father and a team of praying friends stood on a rice field in Beanteay Meanchey, Cambodia, and used sticks to map out this vision's future in the sand.

This annual report will accurately describe the many other "changes" we have witnessed in 2014. Those highlights listed in the pages that follow were once thought unreachable. Through prayer and the power of Jesus Christ in our lives, those once thought "extremely bright and impossible to reach" stars have come from heaven to earth and are now shining for all the world to see.

This is the Time! In 2015, SEAPC will officially begin "Project Stars," a ten-year agreement with the Autism Association of China with the purpose of training 1,000 trainers to serve 500 centers in China that will provide clear answers and possibilities for children living with autism and the families desperate to reach them.

Thank you for giving to SEAPC in 2014. May the Lord return so much blessing and joy into your homes that you cannot contain it in 2015. And may your light shine that all may see and give glory to the Father!

A Letter from Mark

Dear Fellow Bond Servants,

"Changes" and "Completion", the word from which we have come and the word to which we are going. There are several projects and promises out there which have been extended from us as a ministry and to which we must apply our attention.

Three of five prayer centers are currently functioning along the south side of the Himalayas. We must follow through to the completion of the other two. Many of our friends and SEAPC affiliates have become interested in Nepal which should help complete this task.

In sending the "Fab 5," our Cambodian interns to Kampong Thom, we took a major step toward the completion of several promises Pastor Sinai and I had made to a group of old pastors in the region. They want to have a Christian Center with a childrens' home and elementary school. They gave the land for this, and we will build upon it and complete our word to them.

We now have 11 more Christian Centers to build in Cambodia to complete the task of having one in every province and having created space for 1,000 children. Some of the "changes" that have made the way for this to occur have been the refocus of the Cambodia Team after the marvelous Kids Camp, the upgrading of web and magazine communications, and the adoption of different homes by churches and board members. The Lord is always amazing us in the way He raises up new provision.

We will be working this year to complete the certified curriculum for the training of teachers and parents of autistic children in China. Kim Bennett is leading this work and the Lord has provided a wonderful international team to come alongside her. Over the next 5 years, we will see her efforts multiply into the lives of 100,000 trained adults.

We are moving to complete the creation and networking of prayer cells in the 32 states of Mexico. Thank God for Carol Missik and Hector Zetino, the Mexican pastors and the fantastic Friends Around the Table we enjoyed there. We came away from that historic meeting with renewed zeal for the move of the Holy Spirit in Mexico through prayer.

In all these and the many other works we do it is easy to leave the "First Love" prayer and Bible devotion and the simple joy of our salvation. Rev. 2:5 shows us the way back to the presence and joy of the Lord. We, as a ministry, have dedicated ourselves to celebrate our salvation on a daily basis. The feeling of realizing our sins are forgiven is the greatest joy we will ever know.


Leaving those things that are behind, we extend ourselves fully to apprehend that for which we are called. We will complete the race that is set before us.

The SEAPC Ministry Vision *Fu - blessing or prosperity*



1. God:

SEAPC is founded by God and is about God.

2. The Heavenly Line:

The field has a cross in the middle that divides it into 4 sections or platforms:

- We work among the people on the way the Lord creates, but our purpose is to pray the Lord's blessing upon the nation.

Area Representatives

Area Representatives are the back bone of the Advocacy thrust of SEAPC. They are asked to:

- Pray Daily for the Global Community
- ◆ Share SEAPC with one new person weekly
- Host a monthly meeting in which SEAPC updates are shared and prayer is offered for SEAPC friends and the work they do.
- Host a SEAPC event in their region once a year. Either Mark or Matt comes to their area for a few days before and after the event to meet the people with whom they are relating. The events are as varied as Prayer Walk Seminars, Church Mission Conferences, luncheons or outreaches.
- Recruit people for SEAPC short-term trips and SEAPC Coins for Kids.

The eventuality of the Area Representative program is the establishment of an "at home" or church or business-based office. The goal of that office is to add 1,500 new people to the monthly mailing, 250 people supporting one of the children or an SEAPC project, and a core of 50 people who become monthly or regular donors to SEAPC and begin to multiply interest in the region. The representative is also asked to connect with local media for the release of press releases to local papers and to arrange interviews for local radio and TV outlets concerning the fulfillment they are finding through partnership with SEAPC.

- 1. Plow in Prayer **Prayer Walk the place**
- 2. Sow Seed

Students we have trained go to continue prayer walking their region with additional spiritual, human and material resources.

3. Water Relationships

We train the Attack Lamb to find our people with whom they can share Spirit life on a daily basis. It takes about 18 months for new relationships to bear first fruits.

4. Harvest

This can be in terms of support or church planting. Our goal is for every SEAPC recipient nation to become a donor nation.

The SEAPC community communicates regularly, but gathers face to face every one to two years to share the goodness of the Lord and encourage each other.








